



Child Employment Laws – it's nothing new!

You wouldn't let a child work in a mine or up a chimney these days but did you know there are still laws to protect today's children who work, some in equally dangerous activities?

Did you know?

- Children must be 13 to work
- Children can only work restricted hours between 7am and 7pm
- Children may only undertake light work, and some types of work are prohibited
- Employers must register every child employed with their local council
- A risk assessment must be carried out for every child that is employed
- Failure to comply with the legislation may result in legal action

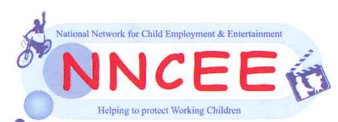

- All children should be supervised by their parent or a registered chaperone when performing
- Without a performance licence children may not be covered by insurance

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
